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

Baby Steps



The Baby Steps Program serves families with children ages birth through five through a variety of programs focusing on healthy parent and child relationships, early brain and language development, behavioral support, developmental interventions, baby calming techniques and every day parenting questions. Our programs work with families to empower them to be the best parents they can be by offering tools and strategies that build upon the strengths they already have to raise healthy and confident children who enter school ready to learn.

Help from the very start

4247 children were served in the Baby Steps program and participated in:

- ♥ BRAIN visits (Building Readiness Among Infants Now)
- Completing developmental questionnaires
- Instructing Infant Massage
- Learning behavioral techniques through our Help Me Behave program
- Completing assessments for infants/toddlers at risk for autism
- Receiving language nutrition education through our innovative WEE Talk campaign

Healthy Families



The Healthy Families Program is a nationallyaccredited, evidence-based family support and coaching program that helps parents provide the safe and stable environments children need for healthy growth and development. Parents voluntarily participate in services provided in their homes. Specially-trained support specialists help them improve their parenting skills and achieve goals that increase family stability and self-sufficiency. Services include modeling of developmental play activities to support the parent-child relationship, monitoring, depression screening, linkages to medical providers and other community resources.

Our families are free of abuse and neglect

- 397 Families served in Martin County
- 211 Families served in Okeechobee County
- 660 Children served in Martin County
- 255 Children served in Okeechobee County

100% of children in families participating in Healthy Families had no verified findings of child maltreatment during program participation

100% of children in families who completed Healthy Families more than 12 and up through 24 months earlier than the end of the report date had no verified findings of child maltreatment within 12 months after completion.

Community Connections



The Community Connections Program serves adults with developmental and/or intellectual disabilities in Martin and St. Lucie counties. Through activities that promote increased life skills and vocational skills, the individuals served are able to increase their independence and become contributing members of their community.

Our clients giving back

- 45 participants spent over 5,000 hours volunteering

Employment Options



The Employment Options Program helps adults with disabilities find and maintain competitive employment in their community. We match the needs of the individual receiving services with the needs of local businesses to find the right job fit! Our Employment Consultants and Retention Specialists are available to help create natural supports on the job so that employment can be long lasting.

Proud working citizens

- This program had 35 job placements this fiscal year.
- Partnering businesses include: Publix, Beall's Outlet, Willoughby Golf Course, Bonefish Grill, WalMart, Winn Dixie, Martin County Clerk of Courts, Burlington, Cleveland Clinic Martin Health, Tamco, Lawnwood Hospital, Lucie Lanes, Sheridan at Hobe Sound, Cracker Barrel and the Martin County School District.
- Project Search returned! Partnership between the Martin County School District and the ARC of Martin County, This is a one-year employment preparation program that combines classroom instruction, career exploration and hands-on-training in the workplace.

Behavioral Health Services



The Behavioral Services Program believes that successful treatment occurs when there is a strong alliance between therapist, the child and the family. Our team of highly skilled therapists provide specialized outpatient mental health treatment for individuals ages five years and above. Along with therapy, our behavioral health department includes a robust afterschool program, case management services and psychiatric services to give a comprehensive and supportive treatment approach.

Mental Health Matters

- **565** children and their families were provided direct therapeutic and psychiatric services
- **85** students participated in our educational after-school program
- **75** children participated in Helping Kids Succeed - a social-skills after-school program
- **9** 30 children were included in Camp Success - a therapeutic summer camp for students with behavioral or mental health issues.
- **11** adults were served through Steps to Succeed – a 12-week program for young adults on the Autism Spectrum that is designed to support an individual's growth in life skills, employment, education, and social skills.

Success Story

Around age two, my son started having violent outbursts and was kicked out of daycare. With two single working parents, the situation elevated to family crisis mode fast. So I sought help.

After many referrals for therapies, Helping People Succeed was the most responsive. Samantha, a Behavior Specialist, scheduled a meeting at a park where she learned about my son's life and bonded with him. She made us both comfortable.

In a new daycare, Samantha helped him with appropriate coping mechanisms and recommended the best local experts. Samantha overcame the roadblocks that I'd encountered and advocated for our son as if he were her own.

Despite Samantha's efforts, this daycare was not prepared to handle my son's issues, so I hired a nanny. Samantha met with my son frequently until his needs were finally met in Felix A. William's Elementary School's special needs pre-kindergarten program.

At Felix, my son had an outstanding teacher who, like Samantha, knew how to bond with him. He began to use his healthy coping mechanisms to make extraordinary progress. When the teacher resigned, Samantha followed my son through substitutes and to the new teacher, giving him one constant adult in his school environment that he knew had his back. Now in kindergarten, he is striving!

This would never have happened without Helping People Succeed. I'd recommend to parents going through similar circumstances to make them your first call for help. I will always be a fan of this organization. The level of service and attention my son received by Samantha was priceless. Nothing short of the miracle we needed to turn things around.

I am forever grateful. Keep up the amazina work vou do! You are proof there are people who care for children struggling to fit in and the parents who love them.
