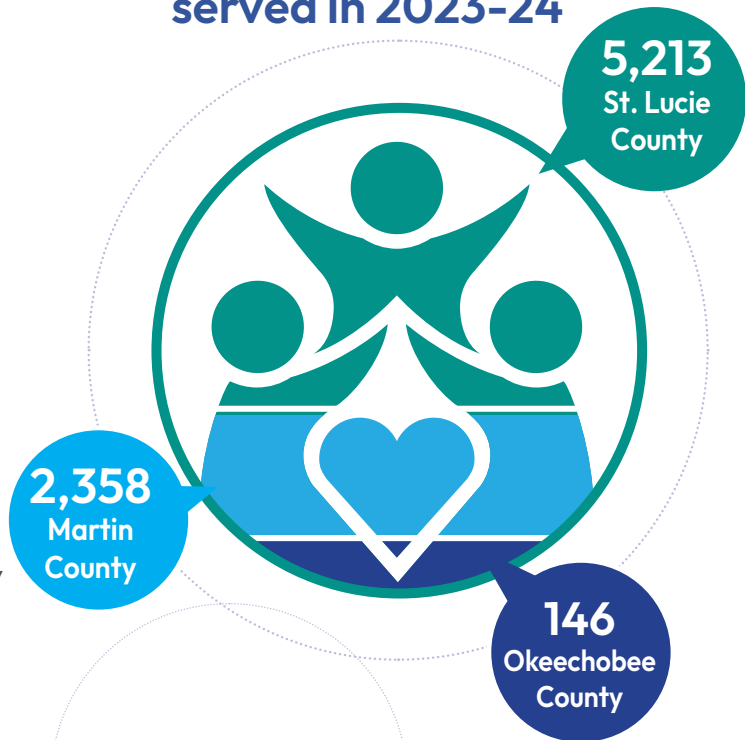

INFANT AND EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAMS



Baby Steps is a suite of programs designed for children from birth to age 5 and their families. It includes infant, behavioral, developmental, and social communication services that support healthy development and prepare children for kindergarten readiness.

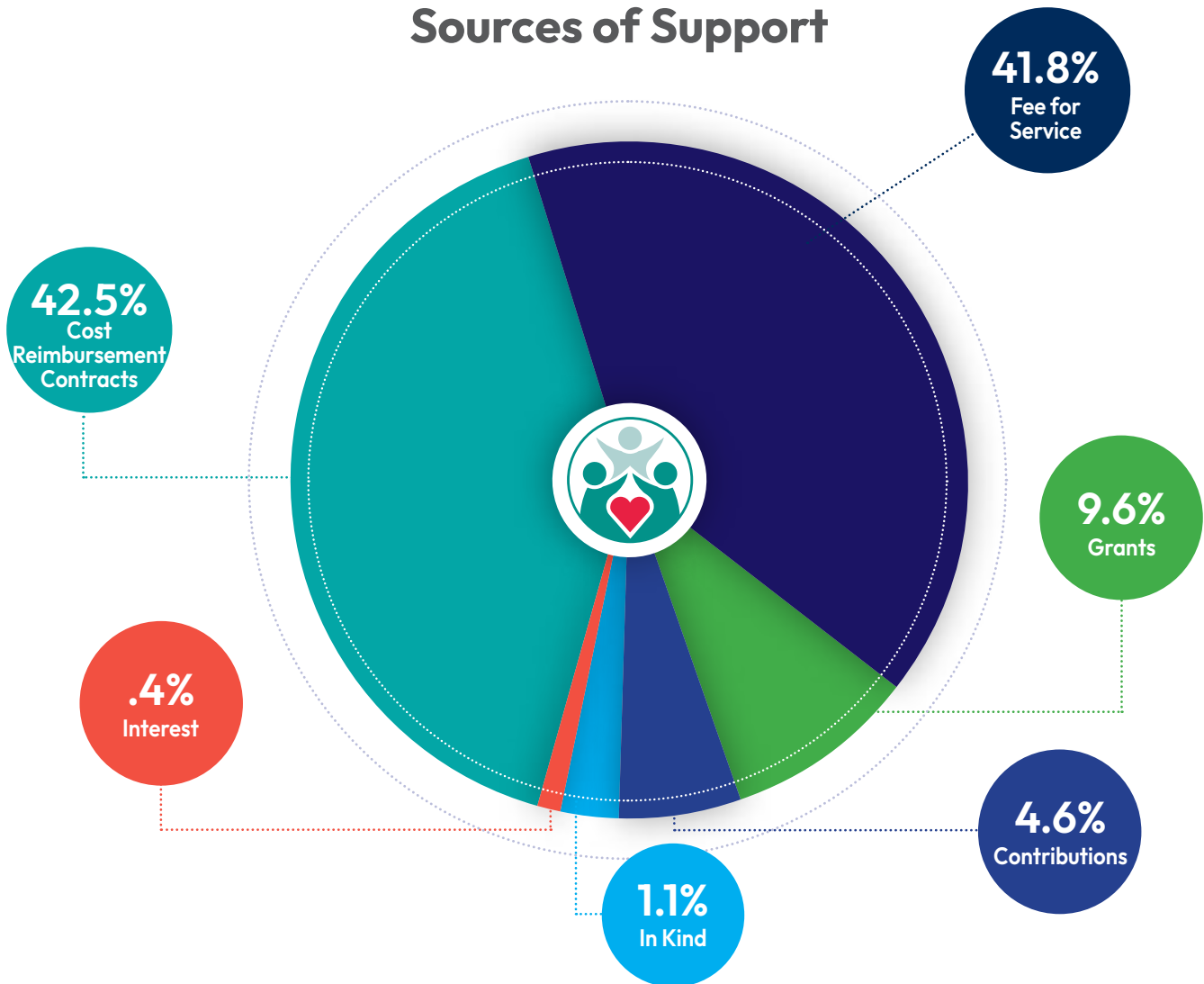
